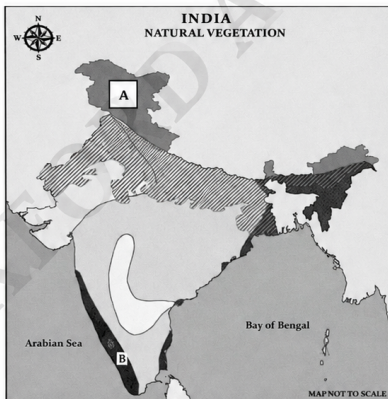

12. Observe the picture and identify the stone age to which these tools are associated with. Mention the features of these tools.



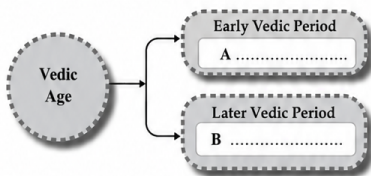
13. Identify and name the natural vegetation types marked as A and B in the given map.

18. What are the factors that helped the early humans in the domestication of animals and in the beginning of cultivation during the Neolithic period?

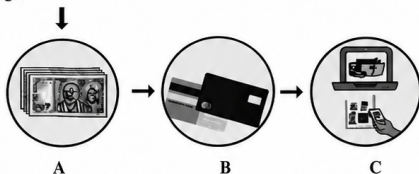
